



A BLESSED FEAST DAY OF ST. JOSEPH TO ALL! (March 19)

There are barely two weeks left for Lent. And I wonder how far we are in our preparation to meet our Risen Lord come the great solemnity of Easter. Are we as anxious as the Greeks in the Gospel today who came with the request: "Sir, we would like to see Jesus."?

But the Lord is quick to remind us that to experience the resurrection, one must be willing to die. "I solemnly assure you, unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit". And Jesus witness to the truth of these words, when He offered His life in the ross for our redemption.

Consequently then for us who profess to be his follower, we too must undergo a certain dying, which is a dying to self, if we would share in His resurrection. It would be a death to self-centeredness, a death to "un-forgiveness," a death to egoistic pride, a death to indifference and apathy and to whatever is an obstacle for Christ to take hold of our hearts.

But we need not be afraid for Lord also assures us: "Whoever serves me must follow me,and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me."

PALM SUNDAY

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, where he was greeted by crowds waving palm branches and crying out, "Hosanna!" This year's Solemn Entrance will start 15 minutes before each Mass and will include the blessing of the palms and the Gospel reading. We invite those who can to gather at the main entrance of the church for the blessing and reading. Reserve signs for the pews will be available for those who come early. Please use caution when returning to your seats. A monitor will be set up in front of the sanctuary so that those who remain inside may also share in the rite. Please be aware that the blessing of the palms is valid whether you are gathered at the front entrance or remain in the church.

HOLY THURSDAY MASS OF THE LAST SUPPER

Immediately following the mass, there will be a procession of the Eucharist to the table of Repose. There will be creative adoration until 12pm midnight

<u>GOOD FRIDAY, 6AM</u> STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Weather permitting, this year St. Joseph Church will offer an outdoor Stations of the Cross at 6am on Good Friday. Join us on this minipilgrimage as we accompany Jesus in his final journey to the Crucifixion and our redemption.

EASTER VIGIL

Easter Vigil begins with the Lucernarium, the blessing of the new fire and preparation of the Paschal Candle. While the church is in darkness, a fire is lit and blessed near the main entrance of the church. After preparing the Paschal Candle, the priest lights it from the new fire and it is carried in procession to stand in front of the sanctuary. As the candle moves forward, ministers share its light with the congregation using small candles. We invite those who can to gather at the main entrance of the church for the Lucernarium. A monitor will be set up in front of the sanctuary so that those who remain inside may also share in the rite. Please be aware that the church will be dark for the rite and use caution when moving to/from the pews.
