

### Weekly Reflection: Palm Sunday – March 25, 2018 "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

Today's celebration of the Palm Sunday or more properly the Passion Sunday (this is the Sunday when the suffering and death of Christ on the cross is proclaimed) ushers the beginning of the Holy Week. But why HOLY WEEK?

Because it is about moving into a HOLY TIME. First, it is entering God's time – the Kairos. The time when we are invited to focus on God's greatest act of love for us – the giving of himself even unto death. It is also the time He fulfills everything He has promised.

Second, because it is the time to ask ourselves about our response to what God is offering to us...whether God is at the center of our lives and whether we love God with all our hearts, our minds, and our strength?

Thus, it is Holy because we are being led to the road of true HOLINESS. So that in the end the cross comes as no surprise: it is the consequence for choosing a life of extravagant love. And such kind of loving is the passion of Christ.

The cross of Jesus stands at the center of the Christian story as the sign of the lengths love will go to in its passion for others. Are we ready to follow Jesus in the way of the Cross?

### PLEASE ATTEND! BRING A FRIEND!

"All that is necessary for evil to prevail is for good people to do nothing." SB 501 is now law in Hawaii. It forces faith-based pregnancy Counseling Centers to tell those who are pregnant where to get free or low-cost abortions.

The United States Supreme Court heard arguments this week on a very similar California law. Like our law, It advocates killing unborn babies. It attacks our right to freedom of speech by *forcing* us to say what is against our conscience.

The case is now before the United States Supreme Court. Let us pray the Court will decide to protect the unborn!



"Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord." (James 5:14)

Let the Lord touch & heal you in all the ways you need to be healed, whether it be physical, spiritual, emotional, mental, or even healing of relationships.... **PALM SUNDAY** (Regular Weekend Mass Times) Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, where he was greeted by crowds waving palm branches and crying out, "Hosanna!" This year's Solemn Entrance will start 15 minutes before each Mass and will include the blessing of the palms and the Gospel reading. We invite those who can to gather at the main entrance of the church for the blessing and reading. Reserve signs for the pews will be available for those who come early. Please use caution when returning to your seats. A monitor will be set up in front of the sanctuary so that those who remain inside may





also share in the rite. Please be aware that the blessing of the palms is valid whether you are gathered at the front entrance or remain in the church.

## HOLY THURSDAY MASS OF THE LAST SUPPER (7:00P)

Immediately following the mass, there will be a procession of the Eucharist to the table of Repose. There will be creative adoration until 12pm midnight

## GOOD FRIDAY, 6AM STATIONS OF THE CROSS & LAST WORDS OF JESUS 12PM (NOON) followed by Good Friday Service (3:00P)

\*Weather permitting, this year St. Joseph Church will offer an outdoor Stations of the Cross at 6am on Good Friday. Join us on this mini-pilgrimage as we accompany Jesus in his final journey to the Crucifixion and our redemption. \*After our Lord Jesus was nailed to the cross, He spoke 7 short expressions. These statements are now commonly refered to as the "The Seven Last Words." These words are recounted in the Sacred Scripture. On Good Friday, we invite our Parishioners to go to the Church to the listen to

the reflection on "The Seven Last Words."

## EASTER VIGIL (7:00P)

Easter Vigil begins with the Lucernarium, the blessing of the new fire and preparation of the Paschal Candle. While the church is in darkness, a fire is lit and blessed near the main entrance of the church. After preparing the Paschal Candle, the priest lights it from the new fire and it is carried in procession to stand in front of the sanctuary. As the candle moves forward, ministers share its light with the congregation using small candles. We invite those who can to gather at the main entrance of the church for the Lucernarium. A monitor will be set up in front of the sanctuary so that those who remain inside may also share in the rite. Please be aware that the church will be dark for the rite and use caution when moving to/from the pews.
