Weekly Reflection: 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time – August 19, 2018

"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

We live in a society that can be mentally challenging. Just imagine your day off at work and just wanting to relax and be free from any stress. You open the tv and is immediately confronted with 100 channels to choose from. Or should you go for a visit at your favorite department store or supermarket and again be challenged which one to pick from the vast selection they have. Gone are the days when there were only two or three good brands of shampoo to choose from and making it easier to decide. And we make our choice even if we choose to shut off the tv or leave the store with empty hands.

The Gospel this Sunday is about a more serious choice we must make in our life. It tells the story of Jesus being rejected by some of his listeners due to his teachings. "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him (John 6:67). When Jesus asked his apostles if they too would leave, Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God (John 6:68)."

Like Peter we must make a choice of either following Christ or leaving Him considering the consequence and difficulty of being Our Lord's disciples. Like Peter we may have our own shortcomings to be considered a good steward of the Lord's Gospel, but our choice today will bring us either a step closer to the Lord's offer of life and love or away from it. But the more challenging part is that we do not only do this once but like every moment of our lives. It is asking ourselves, "Am I offering every breath, every word, every step I make, to the glory of God? Are we ready to make such choice


