

In preparation for a very special centennial event, St. Joseph Church will feature a Mass Marriage Validation with our Bishop Larry Silva on March 23, 2019 at 2:00 pm. Couples who wish to have a sacramental marriage in the church or wish to have their marriage annulled should consider the following:

Cannot Marry in the Catholic Church Due to A Prior Marriage? Pope Francis recently streamlined the process to petition for a declaration of nullity (annulment) to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the mandatory fee. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior marital bond was invalid for some reason, then he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage. For assistance in petitioning, you can contact Father Wilbert or Rose Nunogawa at 935-1465 who can assist you as an advocate.

Weekly Reflection:

"If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured."

Healing stories in the gospel are more than just miracle stories about the extra-ordinary powers of Jesus. It is more about revealing to us the true desire of God for each and everyone of us – that is to experience a fullness of life. Our loving Father desires wellness rather than illness. He brings blessings rather than curses. He brings peace rather than strife, joy instead of sadness, and life instead of death. Consequently, anyone who is close to the Father and loves Him truly is entrusted with the mission of becoming an agent of healing. And this is what we find in Jesus. Jesus was so united with His Father's will and desire for us that He could not but bring about healing wherever he proclaimed the Good News.

This Sunday's readings remind us to be a healing presence. Let us wish each other wellness rather than illness. And just like in the encounter of Jesus with the woman in the gospel, it can simply happen through a gentle reaching out in faith - "If only I could touch his clothes..." Such opportunity to be in touch with the Lord and be touched by Him happens in every Eucharist. And thus, I hope that just before we receive Him in Holy Communion, we put our heart and soul in that beautiful prayer: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."





The RCIA is for:

- Unbaptized... persons at the age of reason (7 years and older) who follow a process to help them grow in awareness to God's call to conversion as well as ways to respond to that call. They are consid-
- ered catechumens.
- Baptized in Another Christian Church... those catechized and uncatechized persons from a faith tradition other than Catholic who are seeking full communion with the Roman Catholic Church (Eucharist and Confirmation). They are considered candidates.
