Weekly Reflection:

A Prophet

Most of the time we think of Jesus as Son of God, as Savior, as Good Shepherd but not very often do we see him as a Prophet. But what does being prophet mean for Jesus? A prophet is the spokesman of God. He speaks what God wants to say to His people, whether they like the message or not. And who was able to do this more truthfully and convincingly than Our Lord Jesus. And He proclaimed God's Word even if it meant facing the consequence of the cross. And for many, this was just too much too accept and chose to reject Jesus after all it is said: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

And such was the case because his message and teachings ran counter to their values and preconceived notions and ideas about God. And as this was true during Jesus' time so it is also for us today. The people today continue to reject Jesus because we do not want to hear the message. They demand so much of us and we cannot make that sacrifice of living not only for ourselves but for God and His Kingdom. Or sometimes, people reject Christ's words because many are already tired of the routine and ordinary things seen in Church.

People long for something new, something different, something exciting. It is a case of "familiarity breeds contempt." But this happens because there is not yet the smallest amount of intimacy with Jesus and his Church. Intimacy with Lord will keep our hearts burning. It could burn our hearts that we in turn recognize the call to be prophet ourselves today.

The RCIA is for:

In the case of children who have reached the age of reason (age 7), the pastor of the local parish should be consulted for information about Baptism and the other Sacraments of Initiation.

Adult Catholics who were baptized and received their First Eucharist in the Catholic Church and are interested in the Sacrament of Confirmation should contact their local parish office.

What is the Rite of Christian Initiation?

The Rite of Christian Initiation is based on the principle that the process of conversion proceeds gradually, in stages. Progress from one stage to the next is marked by a liturgical celebration in the midst of the parish community. The experience and needs of each individual differs, and so the length of time may vary for each person, yet there are certain similarities in the process everyone will experience.
