Weekly Reflection: 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

"...know that He is near!"

This week is the week of Thanksgiving Day. A time to be able to look back in our lives especially for what has transpired in this past year, and see them with eyes filled with gratitude not because they are all happy, successful, promising but because the Lord is present with us and journeying with us at that moment. Thus, we can look at the future with hope that the Lord will also be present with us.

But unfortunately, the world would like us to believe otherwise. It tells us that the future is dark and gloomy if not an unknown territory. Consequently, it instills fear in our hearts. We begin to speculate of the worst scenarios for the end time.

But the Gospel tells us differently. More than anything else the "end-time" of the "Parousia" is centered in the return of Jesus in power and glory at the end of the world, who would gather together the scattered people of God to the Kingdom prepared by God. This then became the source of hope for the early Christian community as well as for all of us. The "end times" is not really the end. It is a beginning. It is a new creation. It is the coming of a new heaven and a new earth, where God will be all in all.


This year December 8 falls on a Saturday. Because the 5pm Saturday Mass is designated for the Second Sunday of Advent, it *CAN'T* be celebrated for the Immaculate Conception.

To help the faithful fulfill the Holy day of Obligation, two Masses will be offered to commemorate the Immaculate Conception: Friday, 12/7, 7pm; & Saturday, 12/8, 7am.

St. Joseph parish will be celebrating our Advent Novena, starting on Sunday, December 16 and culminating with the Christmas Day Eucharistic celebration.

A novena, derived from novem, Latin for nine, is a 9-day period of devotions, either public or private. Called Simbang Gabi in the Philippines, the Advent Novna Masses offer participants the opportunity to travel together on a spiritual and mental

pilgrimage toward the birth of Jesus Christ. Each day of the novena is meant to be an opportunity to reflect on the meaning and significance of the birth of our Lord Jesus in our lives and in our society today.



The Novena requires some stamina because the weekend Masses and the Mass on December 24th start at 4am. The weekday Masses are scheduled for 7pm to accommodate the schedules of working people and students. Fellowship and food will be provided after the Masses. All are encouraged to attend, so that together we may prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of our Lord and Savior.


