

Weekly Reflection: 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday In ordinary Time – Year B - October 28, 2018 "What do you want me to do for you?"

If ever, you will be given the opportunity to be asked by the Lord this question, "What do you want me to do for you?", what response will you give to the Lord? Will we ask for secured life for the years to come, will we ask health and blessings for our loved ones, or will we ask for the end to all the miseries of the world today?

Like Bartimaeus, who was waiting by the wayside, we know that opportunities for a chance encounter with the Lord can just happen when we least expect it. Are we ready to seize the moment to seek for true spiritual growth like the blind Bartimaeus, who did not seek to be been given only the gift of sight but sought also to be given the opportunity to become one of our Lord's disciple.

Jesus is the Light of the world that can dispel all the darkness in our hearts and life that we might be able to see clearly the faces of our brothers and sisters and love them the way Jesus did.

### Catechism of the Catholic Church: "I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY CATHOLIC CHURCH" Paragraph 5. The Communion of Saints All Saints Day is Nov. 1

**946** After confessing "the holy catholic Church," the Apostles' Creed adds "the communion of saints." In a certain sense this article is a further explanation of the preceding: "What is the Church if not the assembly of all the saints?"<sup>479</sup> The communion of saints is the Church.

<u>947</u> "Since all the faithful form one body, the good of each is communicated to the others. . . . We must therefore believe that there exists a communion of goods in the Church. But the most important member is Christ, since he is the head. . . . Therefore, the riches of Christ are communicated to all the members, through the sacraments."<sup>480</sup> "As this Church is governed by one and the same Spirit, all the goods she has received necessarily become a common fund."<sup>481</sup>

<u>948</u> The term "communion of saints" therefore has two closely linked meanings: communion in holy things (*sancta*)" and "among holy persons (*sancti*)."

Sancta sanctis! ("God's holy gifts for God's holy people") is proclaimed by the celebrant in most Eastern liturgies during the elevation of the holy Gifts before the distribution of communion. The faithful (*sancti*) are fed by Christ's holy body and blood (*sancta*) to grow in the communion of the Holy Spirit (*koinonia*) and to communicate it to the world.
