Weekly Reflection: 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year B

“For whoever is not against us is for us.”

We live in a world driven by competition, where there is only a winner and the rest are losers. People seem to be constantly competing for almost everything – yes, in sports but more so for jobs and promotions, for recognition and fame, for control and power, even for love and attention. And because of this perception, many sometimes find themselves doing not so honorable things just to be the “winner”.

Such a competitive attitude is what is reflected in the readings today – both in the first reading and in the gospel. One of the apostles is not happy that someone outside their circle is driving out demons in Jesus’ name. Was it because the disciple was afraid that the other person is getting a lot of attention and eventually that Jesus will lose some followers? Or he is afraid that people will get confused and be led astray? Or that he just does not trust the other person? Or was he simply jealous?

But the response of Jesus is quite straightforward: “Do not prevent him. . . . For whoever is not against us is for us.” In other words, Jesus is telling the disciple to recognize the “good” wherever he finds it. For Jesus the good deeds of people done in His name cannot be a threat to them or their mission. Jesus seems to be saying that goodness should be acknowledged and embraced wherever and in whomever his disciples find it.

In a world of competition, we become suspicious of one another. But Jesus instead desires that we simply rejoice in the good done in His name. And so be it.

Mahalo Nui Loa, and may the blessings of the Lord be upon you, protect you and guide you with his Peace always!

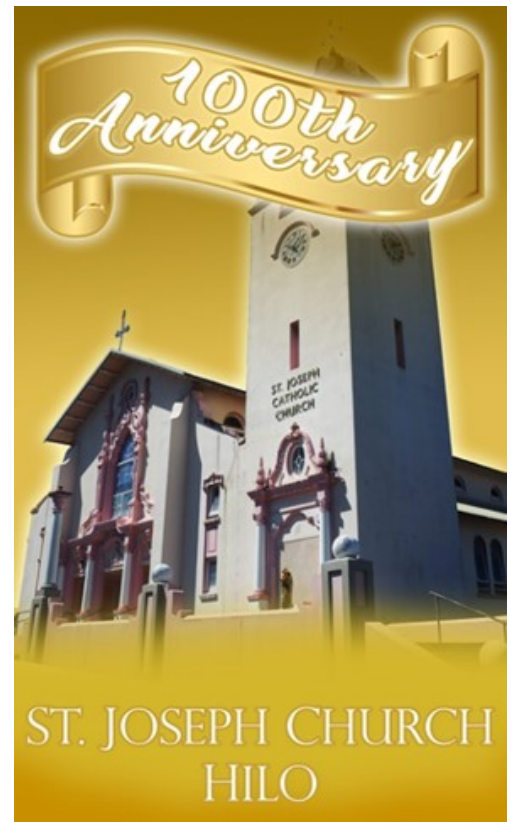

Fiscal Year 2018 was another active year for the St. Joseph Parish Community in Hilo. Through our partnership with Hope Services we helped to provide shelter for the homeless by calling in referrals. Our food pantry donations are now directed to Hope services to assist them in their shelters in East Hawaii.

"Kill the Pain, Not the Patient!"

This spring our legislators made assisted suicide the law of Hawaii, advocating that patients must be able to choose death when they are having intolerable pain, depression or other issues at the end of their life. Their theory "Kill the Patient rather than Kill the Pain," ignores recent advances in medication and techniques for relieving pain and casts aside the dignity and respect for everyone's life that the Lord has instilled in each of us. The goal of the palliative care team is to help manage symptoms such as pain and depression through emotional and spiritual support during a chronic, serious or terminal illness, with the purpose of improving the patient's comfort and quality of life even if a cure is not achievable. More information will be in next week's bulletin, "Killing the Pain, not the Patient," discusses how palliative care differs from assisted suicide and how it benefits both the patient and loved ones.
