

Weekly Reflection: 8th Sunday Ordinary Time Year C - 2019

"...out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good,"

Who is a hypocrite? According to Mr. Webster he is "a person who pretends to have desirable qualities or publicly approved attitudes, beliefs and practices but actually does not possess them."

Jesus detests the hypocrisy. The problem of the hypocrites is that they are more concerned with the outside appearance rather than what is truly in their hearts. And as such they fail to see their real self and thus are unable to enter true and meaningful relationship with others and with the Lord. Hypocrisy hinders the heart from becoming compassionate! A truly compassionate heart is a sharing the heart of God. And from such a heart only goodness comes out – "... the store of goodness in his heart produces good".

That's why in our gospel today, Jesus reminds us to open our eyes in our own faults if we are to help others see their own faults. Because when we are aware of our own weaknesses and strive to overcome them, we are slow to judge and swift to give the other the space where he can work out the change that needs to happen.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. -Luke 4:1-2



FASTING:

LENTEN REGULATIONS

IN THE DIOCESES IN THE UNITED STATES, CATHOLICS AGED 18 THROUGH 59 ARE BOUND TO FAST ON BOTH ASH WEDNESDAY (MARCH 6TH) AND GOOD FRIDAY (APRIL 19TH). TO FAST MEANS TO CONSUME ONE FULL MEAL A DAY AT MOST, ALTHOUGH TAKING OF OTHER, SMALLER QUANTITIES OF FOOD AT THE OTHER CUSTOMARY MEALTIMES IS PERMITTED. FOOD AND DRINK BETWEEN MEALS (EXCEPTING WATER AND MEDICINE) IS NOT PERMITTED ON FAST DAYS.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT:

CATHOLICS AGED 14 AND UP ARE TO ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT, AND GOOD FRIDAY. TO ABSTAIN MEANS REFRAINING FROM EATING BEEF, VEAL, PORK, OR POULTRY AT LEAST, ALTHOUGH EGGS AND MILK PRODUCTS ARE ACCEPTABLE. THE CONSUMPTION OF FISH AND SHELLFISH IS PERMITTED, THOUGH THE PENITENTIAL CHARACTER OF THE ABSTINENCE SHOULD BE KEPT IN MIND.

EASTER DUTY:

ALL THE FAITHFUL, AFTER THEY HAVE BEEN INITIATED INTO THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST, ARE BOUND BY THE OBLIGATION OF RECEIVING COMMUNION AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR. THIS PRECEPT IS TO BE FULFILLED DURING THE EASTER SEASON UNLESS IT IS FULFILLED, FOR A JUST CAUSE, AT SOME OTHER TIME DURING THE YEAR. THIS PERIOD IS EXTENDED TO INCLUDE ALL THE WEEKS OF LENT AND THE EASTER SEASON UP TO TRINITY SUNDAY (JUNE 16TH).

LENTEN PRACTICES:

THE FAITHFUL ARE ENCOURAGED DURING LENT TO ATTEND DAILY MASS, RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION, PARTICIPATE IN PENANCE SERVICES, AND RECEIVE SACRAMENTAL ABSOLUTION; TO TAKE PART IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE EXERCISES OF PIETY, GIVE GENEROUSLY TO WORKS OF RELIGION AND CHARITY, PERFORM ACTS OF KINDNESS TOWARD THE SICK, AGED, AND THE POOR; TO PRACTICE VOLUNTARY SELF-DENIAL, ESPECIALLY REGARDING FOOD, DRINK, AND WORLDLY AMUSEMENTS; AND TO PRAY MORE FERVENTLY, PARTICULARLY FOR THE INTENTIONS OF THE HOLY FATHER. ASH WEDNESDAY, THE FIRST DAY OF LENT, FALLS THIS YEAR ON MARCH 6TH. ASHES ARE TO BE BLESSED AS A SIGN OF OUR ENTRY INTO A SEASON OF CONVERSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION. ASHES ARE TO BE BLESSED BY A BISHOP, PRIEST, OR DEACON, OTHERS MAY BE ASSOCIATED WITH THE CLERGY IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES.


