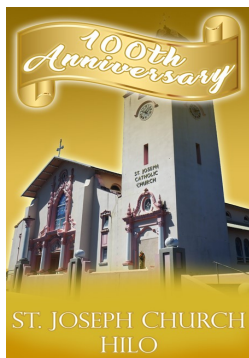

Weekly Reflection: 1st Sunday of Lent – Year C – 2019

“...was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days”

We started the season of Lent with the imposition of ashes last Wednesday. Like Our Lord Jesus’ 40 days of fasting and prayer in the desert, Lent will be a period of 40 days of preparing ourselves for Easter. It is an opportune time to look into how we have been living our lives – whether we have made a choice for God or a choice for what Satan offers through the allurements of the world.



As we reflect this 1st Sunday of Lent on the temptation of the Lord in the desert, we see how Satan tried to seduce Jesus to choose Satan and what he offers over the love of God and the mission that comes with it. Satan tried to seduce Jesus with comfort, with riches, and with power. But Satan failed. But he also was not giving up.

For Jesus, it was a steadfast choice in favor of His Father and nothing else. The keyword is CHOICE! And it is also true for us. At the moment of temptation, we are actually presented with a choice – are we choosing God or are we choosing what Satan is offering?

This Lenten Season, let us pray for the grace to make God our only choice every moment of our lives.

CALDO DE FRIJOL

BLACK BEAN SOUP

Makes 4-6 servings



- 1 T fair trade olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 c water or vegetable broth
- 3 cans black beans, drained and rinsed
- 2 tomatoes, diced
- 1 green chili, diced
- 2 t ground cumin
- 2 t chili powder
- ½ t salt
- Cilantro, minced (optional)

In a large pot, sauté onion and garlic in oil until brown. In a blender, combine 1 c water/vegetable broth and 2 cans of beans. Blend until smooth. Add to onion mixture. Stir in tomatoes, chilis, remaining beans, spices and remaining water/broth. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 15 minutes. Serve with cilantro.

WHAT ARE THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS?

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

The Stations of the Cross are commonly found in churches as a series of 14 small icons or images. They can also appear in church yards arranged along paths. The stations are most commonly prayed during Lent on Wednesdays and Fridays, and especially on Good Friday, the day of the year upon which the events actually occurred.

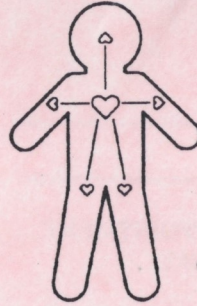
