18th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 2020 "...give them some food yourselves."

With the great advancement we are doing in the field of science and technology, I believe we have the means and resources to produce enough food for the people of the world. And yet, almost 820 million people are suffering from malnutrition and hunger. But not only are there people hungry for food but there are also an equally great number who are hungry for love and affection.

This Sunday, we witness how Our Lord Jesus was moved with compassion at the sight of those people who are hungry. These people came seeking for Jesus with the hope that He would do something to ease their hungers – hunger for healing, acceptance, love and probably God's words. Understanding their suffering, Jesus knew in his heart he had to do something. In a gesture that reminds us of the Holy Eucharist, he took the bread and the fishes, raised his eyes to heaven, pronounced the blessing, broke the loaves and handed them to the disciples to distribute to the people, who have enough to fill their hunger.

The disciples, likewise, recognized the hungers of the crowd, but felt there is nothing that they could do for them. So they ask Jesus "to dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." - The same hunger, but two kinds of responding. Which response are we taking?

Yes, we might not have the super power of miraculously multiplying bread to feed a hungry crowd. But if each one will have the compassionate heart like Jesus to feed just one, don't you think there will be enough of us to erase the hunger of the 820 million. Let us ask for the grace to have the same kind of compassion that Jesus had. A compassion that leads to action. In short, a compassion that gives joy and life. *-Fr. Poli*


All Weekend Masses Require Reservations

In today's Gospel reading, the disciples see all the hungry people who had come to listen to Our Lord and to be healed. They know that they can't feed them all, so they ask Jesus to



Our Lord was showing us that He will provide for all our needs if we listen to Him, just like it says in today's reading from the prophet Isaiah. In this story He was providing for the people's bodily needs, but He also provides for our spiritual needs.

In Holy Communion, Jesus gives Himself to us for spiritual food. Just like He could do the miracle of feeding the five thousand, He works the miracle of turning bread and wine into His Body and Blood for us at every Mass. Now He feeds millions of people all over the world with Himself!
