

When a child is suffering, I think the mother suffers even more. Because hers is not only the physical pain but more so that of the heart who only desires the best for her child.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we encounter this Canaanite mother who approached Jesus crying out, "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on me! My daughter is terribly troubled by a demon." She trusted that Jesus could do something for her child. But the seeming coldness in the response of Our Lord Jesus would have disturbed us today. This, however, was only to highlight the existing barrier between Jews and Gentiles. Once Jesus affirmed the greatness of the faith of this Gentile woman such barrier came crashing down.

But what is faith? Many think it is all about "our belief in a God who exists." But for one who believes and has faith, we know it is more than just knowing that God exists. Faith is placing our trust in God or better yet faith is our readiness to entrust our life to this God who created us out of His great love. And one more thing, Faith is first and foremost a gift that has been offered to us by God, himself. And it is God's joy to give His gifts to each and every one of His beloved children. But faith is not faith unless it is put into action!

As we thank God for this wonderful gift of Faith, let us also pray for the grace we let it shine in our lives.

Does God Only Care for the Chosen People?



Long ago God had set aside the Israelites as His chosen people. He gave them laws and prophets and set up a covenant with them, that they would be His people and He would be their God. He promised them

When He saw how much faith she had, He did what she asked and cured her daughter.

Jesus wasn't trying to make the woman give up. He was giving her a chance to show how much humility and faith she had. Jesus used this to show the people that God will let anyone who believes, like this woman, become part of His chosen people.


- ° Please be in your seat 10 minutes before mass begins. *If not, reservations are forfeited.*

- Parishioners will be confirmed for one (1) reservation. When changing mass time, the original reservation is forfeited.



- PLEASE MAINTAIN A 6 FOOT PHYSICAL DISTANCE FROM THE PERSON IN FRONT OF YOU; FOLLOW THE MARKINGS ON THE FLOOR
