

Prepare the way of the Lord

In this Sunday's gospel, we read St. Mark introducing Jesus with a quote from the Prophet Isaiah: "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you... A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'" And this voice is John the Baptist!

And we can learn from John the Baptist, how we can prepare ourselves in preparing the way of the Lord. He lived in the desert with just the basic necessity and there dedicated himself to listening to the voice of God that came to him in prayer. We can likewise pause and reflect how we have been living our lives? Are we encumbered by too much excess baggage and are just focus in accumulating things that have distracted us from focusing on God and His words? What have we to let go this Advent season?

But more so, John was not focused on himself. He knew "one more powerful than himself is to come. And he is not fit to untie His sandal straps." And that is why he preached a Baptism of Repentance. Only when we have clean and emptied our hearts, will there be a space for the Lord to dwell in our hearts. So we can ask: Who or what is at the center of our hearts?

Advent is like planting seeds today and waiting in hope for them to grow and bloom tomorrow. But meanwhile we need to take care of that seed – water it, till the soil, take out the weed, etc. We cannot remain idle but actively prepare for the coming of the Lord in our lives. And be ready to let Him in.


