## Sunday of the Most Holy Trinity – June 2020 God is Love

We really do not know a person until we know his or her name. We might recognize them but we cannot claim that we know them. As we celebrate today the Feast of the Holy Trinity we are reminded of how God has revealed himself to us that we might get to know Him and thus build a true and loving relationship with Him while remaining its true Mystery. Precisely because He is God and He can exceed our expectations yet by definition He is everything that fits into more than only one being...He is three.

Trinity means "three in one" and that is because the Three Divine Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit are not three Gods but one God. As such, every one of the three divine Persons is eternal, divine, and perfect. This is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself.

But to say trinity is to declare that there is something about God that is at its core, a relationship of love – that is a love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit which overflows to the whole of creation. And from what we know of love among ourselves, we can say that the way to come to God is to love. And as St. John puts it: God is love.

In honoring the Holy Trinity today, we proclaim the reality of a "God who so loved the world that He gave his only son." And thus celebrate God's awe-some love for each other and for all of us. May we respond in kind -- in love for the Triune God and for one another.

You may drop off masks directly to Father Poli at the office or at church.



AT THE CONCLUSION OF MASS, USHERS WILL DISMISS THE ASSEMBLY BY ROWS.


