Fifty (50) boxes of fresh produce (various fruits and vegetables) will be distributed at St. Joseph Church parking lot to only registered parishioners of St. Joseph Church who are impacted by Covid-19. Application process details below. Parishioners will receive confirmation for pickup during the six week interval.

- Why: This produce distribution event is provided to St. Joseph Parishioners who are in need by the United States Dept. of Agriculture (USDA) as part of the Coronavirus Farm Assistance Program in response to the Families First Coronavirus Response Act. This is a collaborative effort of the Roman Catholic Church Diocese of Honolulu, Catholic Charities, Office of Social Ministries, Hope Services, Hilo Products, Inc. and St. Joseph Church.
- ° Who: For St. Joseph Parishioners who are impacted by COVID-19. Please apply for the fresh produce box, 1 per household per confirmation date.
- \*\* How: Parishioners registered at St. Joseph Church can apply by emailing, texting or leaving a voice mail with the following information: Your name, telephone/cell number(s) and email address. Identify your pickup person. ONLY one call per household. We will email, text or call you with confirmation for a specific date only.

  - ° If you do not pick up the produce box by 5 pm of the pickup date, it will be given to another parish family.
- When: Starting May 22nd and Distribution will continue for the next five Fridays: May 29, June 5, 12, 19, 26 at 4:00 pm 5:pm.
- Where: Drive-by pickup at St. Joseph Church-Hilo parking lot.

## ST. JOSEPH CHURCH (PARKING LOT) DRIVE THRU MOTHER MARY FLOWER EVENT

(-People will not be exiting their vehicle and all vehicles will be parked in designated parked stalls)

9:25a – 11:00a Drive Thru floral offerings will be made to the attending minister/clergy.

(They will drive thru and drop off flowers and/or monetary donations. – estimated contact time less than 3 min per vehicle)

Church building(s) will remain closed.

People will NOT be exiting their vehicle. All individuals **MUST USE A MASK.** All family members MUST REMAIN IN THEIR VEHICLE WITH A SEATBELT ON AT ALL TIMES.

For those with trucks, NO ONE is allowed to be in the bed of the truck.

If at any point, a member gets out of the vehicle, they will be escorted out of the line and will not participate in this event.

#### Enter through the Kapiolani & Haili Side Entrance Exit through the Haili Side Exit Only

- All vehicles must follow designated parking lot traffic patterns (do not cut through the lot, please follow the line of vehicles). If there is an overflow of cars in line, you may be directed to a holding area in the grassy field adjacent to our parking lot.
- St. Joseph Church is committed to following the directives from the Diocese of Honolulu and the recommendations made by the Hawaii County.
- All participants and church members will be wearing face coverings, practice social distancing and will disinfect each time after coming in physical contact with items being dropped off.

Dear St. Joseph Hilo Parishioners,

It is with a heavy heart I come to you giving you the status of our parish school but still hopeful.



Over the past years we have supported our parish school. We at the Parish have worked with the school administration and the Diocesan Schools Office to make Catholic Education on Hawaii Island a great first-class education. St. Joseph School received multiple accreditations and is considered a premier educational center for students from pre-school through high school. This has come at a high cost.

Over the years our Parish school has not been able to fully sustain itself requiring assistance from both the Parish and the Diocese. With our recent COVID-19 crisis, this situation has exacerbated. While budgets were balanced, actual tuition receipts were below that anticipated as families have difficulties as the school year progresses. This is the main reason for consistent shortfalls over the past years. The parish and diocese had given as much assistance as it could through the loans that has been extended to the school to cover its necessary expenses.

This past year the school administration has worked very hard to come up with alternatives. With the current COVID-19 crisis new educational models to include numerous on-line courses are being considered. To date, models being considered do not support a self-sustainable St. Joseph School. Many models have been considered to include all or parts of the existing school to continue. With the models considered for the school to continue for one more year outside funding of at least \$500,000 is needed.

Regretfully, neither the diocese nor the parish have the funds to sustain our Parish school for another year. This is especially true now. With the current economic crisis, the parish has laid off employees and continues to pinch pennies just to pay our regular bills (electricity, other utilities, and basic necessities to keep our facilities maintained). With smaller collections, our contribution, and that of other parishes, to the diocese has decreased. Thus, the Diocese is also not able to jump in and help our Parish school.

Nevertheless, in a very recent discussion there are some additional alternatives to be considered. Thus, by June 15, a final decision will be made as to the continued operation of St. Joseph School.


This information is sent to you to provide the most transparency possible. If you, or others you know are willing to commit resources to allow St. Joseph School to continue for another year, please share that with me by the end of this month (by May 30). We will continue to work with the School administration and Diocesan leadership to look at a couple more alternatives. As time is short, we meet frequently to find ways to continue Catholic education on Hawaii Island.

I promise to keep everyone abreast of our considerations and by no later than June 16, to let everyone know of the fate of St. Joseph Schools in Hilo.

Thank you all for your support of St. Joseph Parish and St. Joseph Schools. Please pray for us and for God's guidance to make the best decision for all.
