Those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him.

This Sunday's parable tells us about the ten virgins waiting for the coming of the bridegroom. These virgins, who with their torches to light the path, were suppose to meet the bridegroom as he brings his bride to the house of his father. Because they do not know what time the bridegroom will arrive, they must be prepared for any eventualities especially in making sure they have enough oil to keep their lamps burning. But unfortunately only five were wise enough to bring extra oil while the other five did not. Thus, only the wise ones were able to carry out their duty when the bridegroom finally arrived. They were ready with their lamps. *And those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him.*

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we too are called to be ready — to be ready to meet the Lord when the designated time arrives. Like the wise virgins, we must be ready to meet the Lord with the lamp of faithfulness to God's will burning with in us. We must in every single moment nourish the desire to carry out God's will in our life. Only by living our life to the fullest can we truly prepare to meet the Lord.


