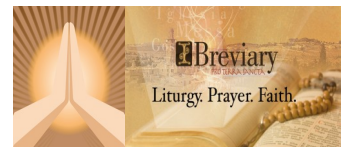

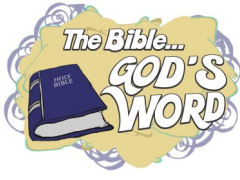

To be part of a community of disciples is integral to our call as a Christian. Or put in another way, while we are called personally by God to be part of His Kingdom, He does so in the context of a community. And so, how we live our lives as a member of a Christian community reflects our response to our Christian vocation.

While the “Church is holy: the Most Holy God is her author Christ, her bridegroom, gave himself up to make her holy; the Spirit of holiness gives her life, She still includes sinners; she is "the sinless one made up of sinners.” (CCC 867) Thus as a community, the Church is called to constantly thread the path of renewal and penance.

This Sunday’s Gospel, reminds us of that responsibility to the community in the face of the possible conflicts and tensions that might arise between members. Jesus compels us that our love for our neighbor must show itself in gentle fraternal correction. It is our Christian responsibility to correct in charity those matters that cause harm to the community. And this we could do if our hearts are attuned to the voice of God that speaks to us, which means we are also a praying community. *"Where two or three are gathered together, there am I in their midst"*. Jesus prays with us and our prayers as a community is most powerful.

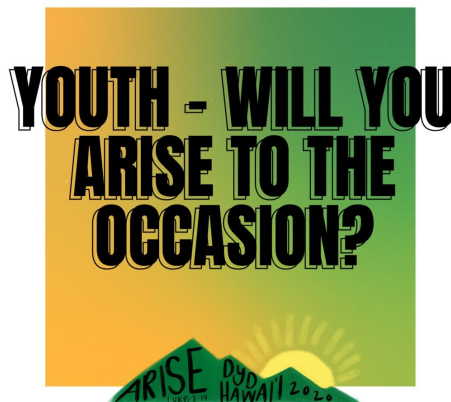

When we talk to somebody about something bad they are doing we should do it with love. We aren't trying to make them feel bad; we're trying to help!

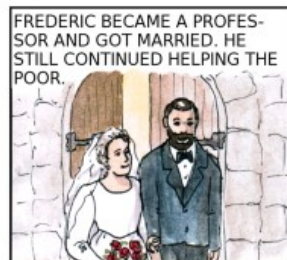
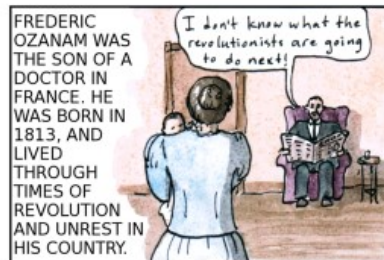

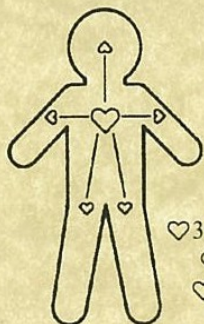
