Please excuse any confusion brought about by my recent absence in the Parish. I was taking a time off to rest after a hectic Lenten and Holy Week schedule and at the same time address my visa status.

My Visa to work in the Diocese of Honolulu expired on April 6 even though I started processing the necessary papers way back in December 2019 with the Diocesan immigration lawyer. Thus far, we have not received any words from the Homeland Securities and the Immigration Office. Currently, I am allowed to stay in the United States with a tourist visa and that will expire in November 2021. Hopefully, this situation will be resolved soon. But it also may take some time. I will continue to take residence in the Parish rectory while awaiting the progress of my visa application.

Meanwhile, because I have no visa to work that means I can no longer be officially employed by the Diocese of Honolulu. With no permit to work. I, therefore, cannot do the normal administrative work in the Parish and likewise cannot celebrate Mass and other sacraments. Consequently, because I am not employed, I will not receive work compensation from the Parish. For this reason, the Diocese is sending some priests to assist in the celebration of the Sacraments and attend to the spiritual needs of the parishioners.

I am sure that St. Joseph, Our Patron, will be guiding and accompanying us during this time. God bless and let us continue to pray for one another.
