3rd Sunday of Advent – 2021 ©

"Rejoice in the Lord always!"

As we light the third candle of our advent wreath, we immediately realize that something is different this Sunday. Instead of the purple or violet candle, we light the pick one. This is to remind us of the joyous anticipation in the midst of our fervent waiting. That is why the third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday" or the Sunday of Rejoicing. And this we find in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always!"

But what does it mean to rejoice in the Lord? While it entails praising and thanking God for all the good things he does, it means something more. For life is not every day a bed of roses. Faced with trials and difficulties, are we still able to rejoice because of the trust we have in God? "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God" (Phil 4:6).

Consequently our rejoicing-turned-thanksgiving leads us to be a channel of God's goodness to others. "Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near." Just like in the Gospel, when John the Baptist was asked by the people what should they do to be able to welcome the Lord in their lives, he was quick to respond that they must be attentive to what will be good for their neighbors – "to act justly, love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God." Then even the Lord will be rejoicing with us for the good that we have found!



Lighting the Rose Candle

Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple, and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candles symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time.

The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over, and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.
