

## 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary time – 2021 B

"If you want to, you can heal me."

The Gospel this Sunday tells the story of Jesus healing the leper. The leper was bold enough to approach Jesus when they were prohibited by law to come into contact with other people because they will make them unclean. In the same way, Jesus set aside the law when he touched the leper thus making himself unclean. There can be no limit nor obstacles to his compassion. However, the good news is, instead of Jesus becoming unclean, the leper became clean, "And immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean." This miracle happened because two people took risks.

For the leper, his boldness was coupled with humility – humbly kneeling down before Our Lord he pleaded: "If you want to, you can heal me." In his heart He knew that only God can cure him just like when we know that no one else can help us, we turn to God in prayer. And the more we sincerely pray, the more our hearts become humble. And at this moment, we are brought in presence of our most compassionate God. And then everything changes for us. So that even what we are praying for is changed to what this loving God desires for us. The best assurance we have is that if God is with us, then we are in the best hands.


# SJC Safety & Security Project Effective February 1st.

## **Lent Starts Next Week!** 4 Easy Ideas for a Lenten Devotion

Don't just give something up this Lent—add a spiritual practice to go deeper in your relationship with the Lord.

#### Here are some ideas.

- 1. Go to Mass. Make the commitment to add a Friday Mass (or Monday, or Tuesday . . . ). Even if your parish can't host the Stations of the Cross or a fish fry, you can still come together for a community devotion.
- 2. Make a holy hour. If you don't regularly go to Eucharistic adoration, start spending an hour (or thirty minutes) each week in front of the Blessed Sacrament.
- 3. Reflect on the Sunday readings. One way to keep our minds focused on Lent and preparation for the Resurrection is to reflect on the Sunday Mass readings.
- **4. Get kids involved.** Help them understand why we make Lenten sacrifices and why Easter is so important. Teach kids the Lenten story and get them thinking about why Jesus died for us.

The ministry of the Permanent Diaconate is new, yet, in another sense, ancient; it traces its roots to the time of the Apostles. The Diaconate flourished as an official ministry in the Early Church but, in time it became a step toward priesthood and, thus, became a transitional office. The Second Vatican Council restored the Permanent Diaconate as a unique way to serve the people of God in a threefold ministry of word, sacrament and charity. The introduction of the Ministry of the Permanent Diaconate to the Diocese of Honolulu in 1978 was a bold and forward thinking event that demonstrated a true commitment to providing this service in a unique and powerful way.

The Deacon is empowered by his bishop to administer Infant Baptism, witness marriage, officiate at wakes, funerals and burial services, administer sacramentals, preside at prayer services, distribute Holy Communion, proclaim the gospel and deliver the homily.

The Deacon's ministry of charity calls him to areas of need in which he demonstrates particular expertise or talent. These areas may include hospital/hospice chaplaincy, prison ministry or other works designed to assist the poor and marginalized members of society.
