Our forty days of Lenten journey is meant to help us prepare to participate truthfully in the Paschal Mystery, that is the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus. This means to be ready to embrace the cross of Our Lord jesus, to die with Him if only to rise with Him come Easter Day! And while it is called to be a season of penance, it is more than just a time for admitting our sinfulness. 



The Deacon is empowered by his bishop to administer Infant Baptism, witness marriage, officiate at wakes, funerals and burial services, administer sacramentals, preside at prayer services, distribute Holy Communion, proclaim the gospel and deliver the homily.

The Deacon's ministry of charity calls him to areas of need in which he demonstrates particular expertise or talent. These areas may include hospital/hospice chaplaincy, prison ministry or other works designed to assist the poor and marginalized members of society.
