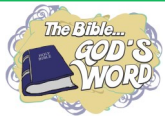

2021 – Feast of the Lord’s Baptism (B)

“You are my beloved Son...”

This Sunday celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season for the Church. And our reading opens us up to the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry.

Today’s feast, echoes what has been proclaimed during his birth – that Jesus is the beloved Son of the Father! St. Mark tells us that as Jesus was coming out of the water after His baptism by John, the heavens opened and the Spirit descended on Him like a dove. Then a voice coming from the heavens was heard: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." The identity of Jesus is made known so that all doubts about Him could be dismissed.

If Jesus is the beloved son, how rightfully then that Jesus will speak to us of God as Abba - that is “His loving Father”! And this is the gift that He would like to share with us - that we too may build a loving relationship with God and be able to truthfully call God as “Father” To Jesus, we all are the Father’s Beloved Sons and Daughters!

But as it is a special grace and privilege to have a loving Father in heaven, so is it a great responsibility. Because to be son or daughter of our loving Father in heaven, we must witness by our life our embracing His will and the mission that comes with it.

And it begins by seeing every person as a child of the same Father and therefore – a brother or sister that we must love the way the Father loves them.

As we welcome the New Year 2021, may the Good Lord bless all our families with His Love and Presence the whole year through.


