Faith & Reason as lifelong partners; Gifts from God.

"Natural reason is the inbuilt essence or ability to know reality" (Dr. Sirilla, FUS, Week 8). "We can come to know natural reason through two natural paths to knowledge, 1) sense evidence which is the reliable means by which we know reality and 2) intellectual knowledge

which is the knowledge of the immaterial" (Dr. Sirilla, FUS, Week 8).

"Faith is based on the word of God...when we make an act of faith we accept doctrine as true, because God, who knows all things cannot lie, affirms it" (Sheehan, Apologetics & Catholic Doctrine, 284). Faith is necessary for salvation according to the document from the first Vatican council, "This faith, which is the beginning of human salvation, the Catholic Church professes to be supernatural virtue, by means of which, with the grace of God inspiring and assisting us" (Dei Filius, Ch. 3 a. 2). The Church teaches that there are two actions of faith. The first is fidei quae creditur, defined as the faith that which is believed. This faith is the content of what God has revealed to the Church as truth. The second is fidei qua creditur which is the faith on what one personally believes. This faith is a gift from God, motivated by trustworthiness of God through signs of credibility. Although man may have difficulties in his understanding of reality or he may question things about faith, there can be no room for doubt or opinions as God cannot deceive nor be deceived.

Faith and reason are harmonious with one another and although found at times to act independent of one another cannot contradict each other. They mutually support one another. "All faithful Christians are forbidden to de-

fend as the legitimate conclusions of science those opinions which are known to be contrary to the doctrine of faith" (Dei Filius, Ch. 4 a. 9). "We define that every assertion contrary to the truth of enlightened faith is totally false" (Dei Filius, Ch. 4) a. 7). "When divine revelation is properly understood by the mind of the Church and when natural reason is properly operating concluding to the truth, not a mistake, then there will never be a contradiction between the two because God is the author of both orders of knowledge" (Dr. Sirilla, FUS, Week 8).

"Nevertheless, in order that the submission of our faith should be in accordance with reason, it was God's will that there should be linked to the internal assistance of the Holy Spirit external indications of his revelation, that is to say divine acts, and first and foremost miracles and prophecies, which clearly demonstrating as they do the omnipotence and infinite knowledge of God, are the most certain signs of revelation and are suited to the understanding of all" (Dei Fillius, Chapter 3). God is all-knowing and all-loving is a philosophical truth. Thus, God in His omnipotence, is the author of all truth both natural and supernatural. Therefore, faith and reason can never

truly contradict each other. The gifts of both faith and reason, when working together, help us become the closest we can to God.

decorate the altar areas with flowers and foliage once a month. Each team serves on a set Saturday, 8:20 - 9:40a. Each team consists of 3-5 members.

- B. <u>Church Cleaning Team</u> members Each team serves on a fourth Saturday rotation, 8:20-9:40 am and consists of
- 8-12 members.
- C. <u>Hospitality Ministers</u> serve one mass per weekend. Six team members arrive one hour before (Sat 5p, Sun 7a, 9a, 11:45a, 6p) to prepare the church and welcome members using safety protocols. During mass, ministers return to their seats; then, assist at communion and follow end of mass protocols. After mass, 3 additional ministers spend 5 minutes disinfecting the church for the next mass. Approximately, 45 hospitality ministers serve parishioners at 5 masses each weekend.
