Effective Easter Sunday, April 4 (or as of the Easter Vigil, April 3), **Bishop Silva will be ENDING the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass**. However, anyone who is sick, may have been exposed to anyone with COVID- 19, or who has a health condition that would endanger themselves or others by being present in church, continues to be dispensed. This means that individual pastors & deacons within a parish will work to better accommodate **the**

<u>needs of their own parishes</u> while following all the authorities of the state government & island county leadership. St. Joseph Church has not made any changes regarding our seating structure for Masses or seating request process at this time. Social gatherings are not permitted, and meetings held at the parish remain limited to no more than ten individuals. All health protocols remain in effect and must be observed.
