Be Opened!

It is not uncommon to see today in a restaurant that a family or a group of people gathered around a table and each one busy playing or attending to their cellphones. Do they have time to listen to each other?

And yet, listening is most likely the best gift we can offer to each other. Because when we choose to truly listen to one another, we create a sacred space where God is able to reveal Himself in our world today. True listening is not only a sign of respect for the other, it is a sacred gift!

In our Gospel this Sunday, we hear how a deaf man with a speech impediment was brought before the Lord to be healed. Unable to communicate, he must have lived in isolation. But this deaf man's greatest suffering would have been his inability to hear the Word of the God when Jesus proclaimed them. And this is the spiritual deafness that the Lord desires to heal in each one of us if only we would allow him to do so. "Be opened!" is what the Lord wants to happen to all of us – Open to His words, Open to His Presence, Open to His Love and Mercy, Open to welcome our brothers and sisters especially the weak and isolated!

SUMMARY GUIDANCE FOR COVID-19 CASES & CONTACTS



Cases vs. Contacts

CASE A person who

tests positive for COVID-19, with or without symptoms



CLOSE CONTACT: HOUSEHOLD

A person who lives in the same house and has ongoing contact with the Case

CONTACT OF A CLOSE CONTACT

A person who lives with or has been in contact with a Close Contact but has had no contact with the Case

CLOSE CONTACT: NON-HOUSEHOLD

A person who has been within 6 feet of the Case for a combined total of at least 15 minutes over a 24-hour period (starting 2 days before the Case became ill or tested positive for COVID-19)

What does this mean?


