

24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in ordinary Time – 2021 (B) "Faith, if it does not have works, is dead.

#### What is this program?

It is an online virtual presentation of highly renowned professionals from Franciscan University in the non-degree program where individuals or small Christian Communities can join at their own paces and take their own "tracks" of topics. Gathering the people at the parish, providing quality trained Catechesis is not currently available and possible, but with The Franciscan University Catechetical Institute, the Church can.

Individuals have free entry once their parish or school has registered in our system. Once their institution has subscribed, they can then go to www.FranciscanAtHome.com. Once there, scroll down to the following section with a blue button:

By clicking on this button, they can then fill in registration information to create a new account. After completing the registration, they are then taken to a page that asks for the name of their diocese. Once they choose the name of their diocese, the name of their parish or school will appear in the second drop-down box (provided that their parish or schoolhas registered already). Once they have selected their parish or school, they have access to all the workshops for free!

# Memorial Mass planned for the late Bishop Amando Samo



St. Joseph Church will have a Memoral Mass on Monday, September 13 at 6:00 pm tin honor of the late Bishop Amando Samo who died on August 7, 2021.

Bishop Samo was born on Moch Island in the state of Chuuk, Federated States of Micronesia in 1948. He did some of his studies

for the priesthood at Chaminade College of Honolulu, residing with Hawaii seminarians. He was ordained a priest in 1977.

He was ordained a bishop in 1987, auxiliary to Bishop Martin Neylon of the Diocese of Caroline Islands, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Cathedral on Moen Island.

Father Samo was appointed coadjutor bishop of the diocese from 1994-1995 and named diocesan bishop in 1995. He retired on Feb. 2, 2020, after suffering a stroke.
