5th Sunday of Lent – 2022

“ two of them alone remained ”

As we approach the end of our Lenten journey, our Gospel this Sunday invites us to reflect on how we deal with an erring brother or sister. Are we ready to forgive and follow the example of Jesus who forgave a woman caught in adultery or are we quick to condemn the way the scribe and pharisees did.

More than their concern for the woman, the whole situation was intended to be a trap for Jesus. If he let her go, he would be transgressing the law. And if he had condemned her then where is the compassion he preached?

In response Jesus bent down twice to write on the ground with his finger...what He wrote no one knows. And here we are reminded of the “ tablets of stone, written by the finger of God ” given to Moses. They were written to give life not death.

And compassionately, Jesus said: , “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” Jesus was showing them how God dealt with sinners. He was not closing his eyes to the sins of the woman but he was inviting the people not to be too quick to condemn for we are all sinners in need of God’s mercy.

And as Jesus was left alone with the woman, it is as St. Augustine wrote: ***the two of them alone remained: Mercy with misery.***

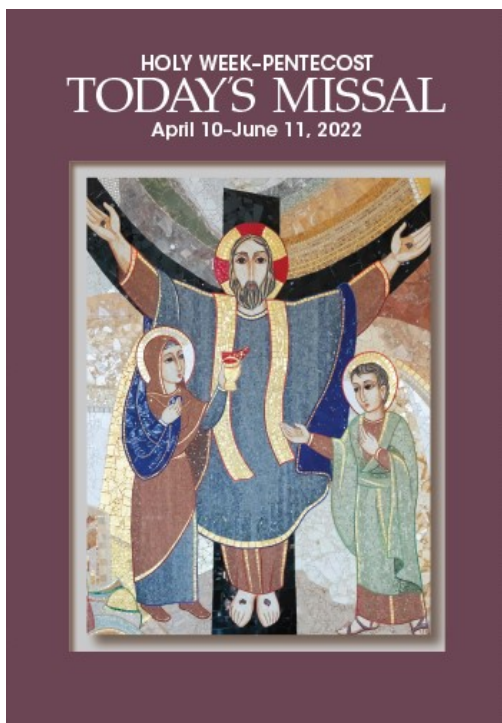
