

"Put out into the deep waters"

Who is not afraid of the deep waters of the open sea? Even seasoned fisherman know the dangers that lurk in the deep waters. It will always be an unknown territory and can easily instill fear in one's heart.

That is why when Jesus commanded Peter to put out into the deep waters, it required not only obedience but even more so he needs to trust in the Lord. After all, Peter was a fisherman and the demand came from a carpenter. Peter needs to trust that the Lord knows what he is doing and trust that the Lord will never abandon them and fail them. Only after he surrendered himself to Jesus did he began to understand what it will mean to have faith in Jesus and be his follower. And he felt unworthy probably because of the fears and doubts that he has. But Jesus was willing to put His trust in Peter and to make him fishers of men.

Like Peter we probably have our own fears to face. Fear of failing health, fear of the pandemic, fear of the uncertainty of the future, fear of failures and rejection and a host of many other fears. And I think the challenge of the Lord for us in the gospel today is precisely to put out into the deep waters of our fears and start confronting them. Because fear can paralyze us from responding fully to the invitation of the Lord so as to become fishers of men and bearers of the good news. And fear can likewise rob us of the miracles that the Lord has in store for us. But know that Our Lord will not leave us on our own but will be there journeying with us and watching over us. We only have to trust in Him.

If we truly love the Lord, then we know "Love dispels all fears."
