6th Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year C – 2022

"Blessed are you..."

An ordinary Jew during the time of Jesus believes that keeping the commandments is the best measure of one's relationship with God. And then Jesus came and speaks of another way of living out our faithfulness to God.

In today's gospel, in his sermon on the plain, where our Lord outlines for His disciples what will be demanded of a disciple or to be a follower of his, he gives us the Beatitude – in Luke's version it is a list of both blessings and woes. And which one will a person receive is not dependent on Christ but on the choice a follower will make. To prioritize wealth, power and prestige does not assure us on true happiness. In fact, it can make life sad and bitter. At the same time, prioritizing God to the point of being able to give up the securities the world offers and let God take hold of our lives is the true path to happiness.

And what does it mean to be BLESSED. And Our Lord's life is the best witness on "this blessedness". Jesus lived a life of poverty and yet was always filled with joy to share whatever he has to others. He experienced what it means to be hungry. He wept at the death of Lazarus. He was hated and persecuted by his enemies. But He chose to trust in God and be the channel of God's love. Jesus was indeed the Blessed One of the Father.

To choose the way of Jesus, is to embrace the path of blessedness. But to reject him is to walk the path of woes. Which path are you taking?


