4th Sunday in ordinary Time – 2022 (C)

No prophet is accepted in his own native place.

After initially receiving a warm welcomed by His people, the tide has suddenly changed and we hear of the opposition Our Lord encountered from his town mates. They did not like the way Jesus was standing true to His mission of bringing the Word of God and not to be manipulated by them. **Indeed, no prophet is accepted in his own native place.**

Accepting God’s words is a challenge that confronted not only the people in the bible but also for us today. Jesus has to contend with the prejudices of his own people, who found it difficult to put their faith in Him because He refused to compromise the Word of God. Jesus is telling them that God cares for all of his people and will reach out to anyone who needs His help. This infuriated his listeners, who considered themselves to have a monopoly on God. They were God’s chosen people, and they resented the fact that Jesus was putting them all on the same level.

Today’s Gospel is a reminder to us of our own lack of faith in accepting God’s word and presence that comes to us in so many forms, some quite baffling, as a neighbor whom we find quite difficult to deal with. Or in a situation beyond our control such as the Pandemic. Could they in fact be “God in our midst,” sent to teach us something about faith, hope and love? Such a possibility should never be ruled out.

Are we ready to be surprise by God the way Jesus surprised his own townmates?

Thank you for all those who lead our Catholic schools.

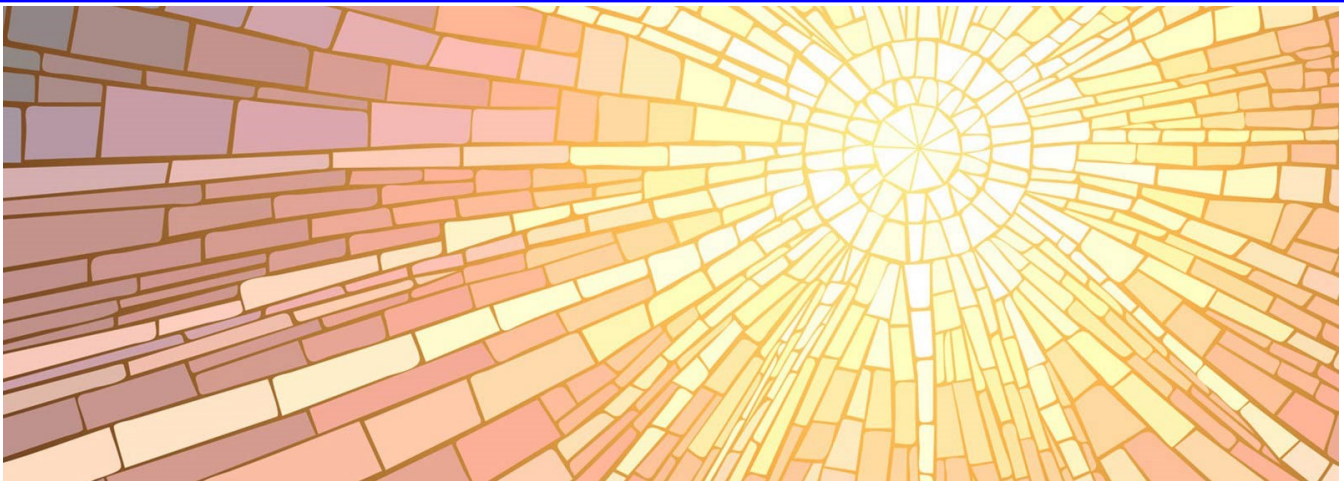
May they be people of integrity so that they can be witnesses as well as teachers. We pray that the schools they lead will become places where our young people can experience your love in their lives.

POPE FRANCIS PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH

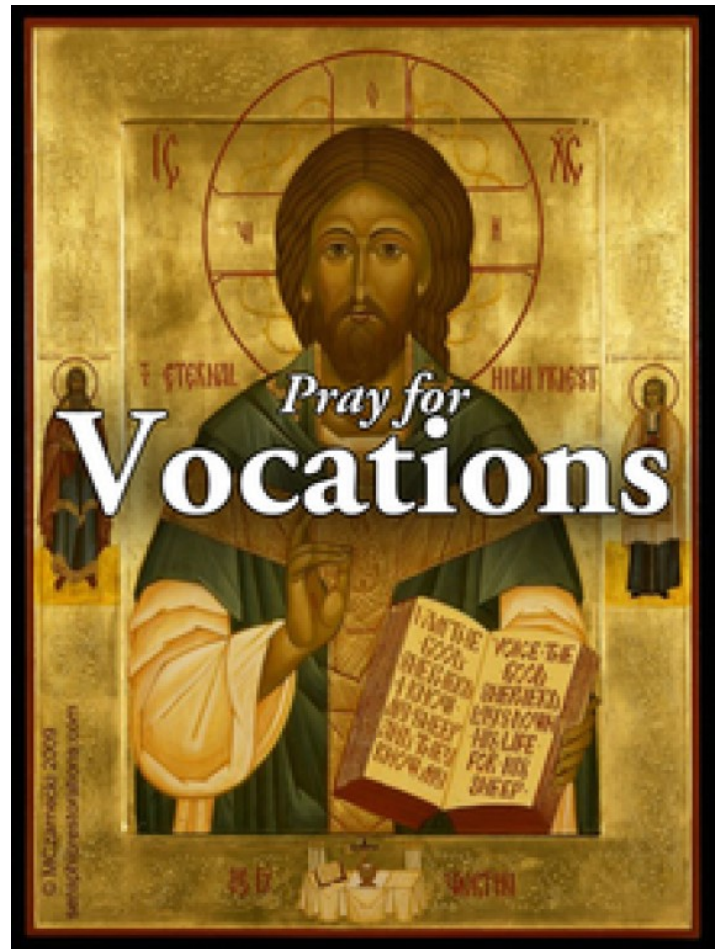
Hail, Guardian of the
