A love stronger than death

The Sadducees in the Gospel do not believe in the immortality of the soul and the soul's resurrection into everlasting life. What matters is our life now for this is the only one we will ever have. On the other hand Jesus was preaching about the truth of the Resurrection and of eternal life. And that is why the Sadducees thought of ridiculing Jesus with the story of the woman who married seven times. But the true issue is not about marriage as it is about the truth of the Resurrection from the Dead!

Thus, in response, Jesus made them realize that their forefathers – Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, believe in the God of the living and not of the dead. They continue to live in the presence of God. And all because the love of God is stronger than death!

But it is important to remember before we talk of life after death, we have first to deal with a life before death. What has truly given meaning to our life now? If it is the world that gives it meaning, then we value what this world offers knowing that this world is but a passing reality. But if it is God and his love for us that gives meaning to our life then this will also be reflected in the kind of life we live. And because God is eternal so is his loving relationship with us.

This month of November is the month of remembering our faithful departed. We offer a prayer for them entrusting them to the great mercy of God. And we do so because we believe that death is not the end but the door that opens to life in eternity, a life after death.

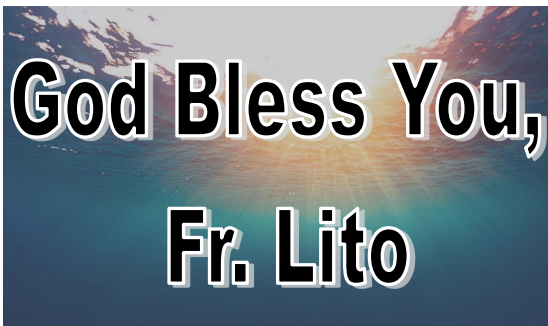
PRAYER FOR ELECTIONS
