3rd Sunday of Lent – Year A – 2023 "Give me a drink."

When was the last time you gave a thirsty stranger a drink? Who knows, it might just be Jesus asking for it? In today's Gospel, the meeting of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well started with a simple request: "Give me a drink."

Ordinary as it may seem, Jesus broke some Jewish customs . First, he spoke to a woman and that she is a Samaritan makes it worse. Second, he knew that she has a sinful past. And, thirdly, drinking from her jar would make him unclean. But all these did not stop the Lord from reaching out to her. He would not judge and condemn her, and thus she gradually opened herself to the grace that Jesus was offering her. In the end, she became an evangelizer – sharing to others the good news of encountering Jesus.

Hopefully, following the example of Jesus, we too can offer such a warm welcome and a grace-filled presence to others. This might just be the beginning of another conversion story. And likewise, a hungry, or thirsty or a person-inneed may very well be Our Lord giving us an opportunity to welcome Him into our lives.

As we continue our meditations for this season of Lent, we can ask the question, "What do I thirst for?" Where do I seek the answers? And let us pray that we might be led to the well of living water.


