#### A Day of Jesus

How is your day? Are you bored or are you busy? Or is it as Job in the first reading described it a drudgery i.e. an uninspiring and fatiguing labor? Or is it filled with endless opportunities for you to be a witness of Christ to others?

Our Gospel this Sunday gives us a picture of what an ordinary day looks like for Jesus during his public ministry. He begins his day rising very early before dawn to pray. And then he carries out the mission of proclaiming the Kingdom of God by instructing the people and healing those who are sick.

So what does this reveal to us about Jesus? He was a man of Prayer! Communion with His Father was central to his life and mission. For Jesus, every thing he does springs from the fruit of his listening to God's voice in his life. It is from such intimate relationship with His Father that he was able to bring the Good News to every person He encounters. I am sure many of us are thinking that it was easy for Jesus to accomplish as he had the capacity to bring healing and well being to those who are sick and suffering. But let us not forget that Jesus has his own share of difficulties when people reject him or choose not to listen to him.

How about us? What are our every day priorities? And where do we draw our strength and energy to live our days to the fullest? Should we not do how Jesus did it – beginning and centering our lives in communing with Our Father in Heaven?


